Day 1 Flight to Quito, overnight at hotel
Day 2 Quito to Galápagos - board ship
Days 3-8 Galápagos National Park
Day 9 Fly to Quito, overnight at hotel
Day 10,11 Fly home (possible overnight flight)

Day 1: Friday, Nov. 5 - Our adventure begins with a flight to Quito, Ecuador. We transfer to our hotel for an overnight stay.

Day 2: Saturday, Nov. 6 - Morning flight to Galápagos Islands to board our ship. (B, D)

Day 3 - 8: Sunday to Friday, Nov. 7-12 Captain's Choice! Depending on conditions, traveling to a variety of islands. (B, L, D daily)

Galápagos Islands

Below are a selection of islands we may visit during our expedition. Subject to change per Galápagos National Park regulations.

North Seymour: Follow coastal trails past playful Galápagos sea lions on this wildlife-rich central island. Continue inland through a silvery forest of endemic palo santo trees, where frigatebirds nest, blue-footed boobies dance and where you may also encounter prehistoric-looking land iguanas feeding on cactus.

Isabela: Cross the Equator at Volcán Ecuador, northernmost of Isabela's six great shield volcanoes. Keep an eye out for whales, dolphins, sea turtles & the elusive ocean sunfish. Over two days, land in the footsteps of Darwin and Melville, and look for wildlife along the wildly eroded volcanic shore.

Fernandina: One of the most active oceanic volcanoes in the world, Fernandina is the

youngest, most pristine island in Galápagos—and home to the strange flightless cormorant Galápagos penguins and the largest marine iguanas.

Española: See swallow-tailed gulls, Española mockingbirds, Nazca boobies and, seasonally, the world's only population of waved albatross at this bird paradise, also home to vividly colored marine iguanas. Watch sea lions on the white sand beach and snorkel offshore at Gardner Bay.

Floreana: Follow a trail past a pink-tinted lagoon sometimes frequented by flamingos. Snorkel among sea lions and abundant fish or cruise along Champion Islet by Zodiac. Visit the historic mail barrel at Post Office Bay.

Santa Cruz: Visit Puerto Ayora, the largest town and headquarters of both the Galápagos National Park and Charles Darwin Research Station. See the monument to Lonesome George and tour the giant tortoise breeding corrals. Witness giant tortoises roaming in the wild in the lush, green highlands.

Bartolomé: Climb the steps to the summit of this 300-foot volcanic wonder for stunning views. Explore, swim, snorkel from the beach. Catch a glimpse of Galápagos penguins, one of the world's rarest.

Santiago: Explore tide pools and look for fur seals sheltered in quiet grottos of black basalt. Swim, snorkel, kayak and paddleboard along Santiago's spectacular coast, and explore an enchanting coastal forest where Charles Darwin once walked.

Genovesa: Sail across the Equator to the remote northern realm of the Galápagos into this flooded caldera, home to over one million seabirds. Visit Prince Philip's Steps at the top of the island.

Highlights along the trail are many, from Nazca, red- and blue-footed boobies & frigates, to gulls, owls, fur seals, hammerhead sharks, turtles and manta rays.

San Cristobal: Search for red-footed boobies and the endemic mockingbird and lava lizard—found only on this easternmost island. Walk along the powdery white sand at a gorgeous beach fronted by iconic Kicker Rock. Explore Baquerizo Moreno, where sea lions thrive in the middle of town.

Day 9: Saturday, Nov. 13 - Galápagos Islands / Quito Disembark the ship this morning and transfer to the flight to Quito; Upon arrival in Quito, unwind at our hotel this evening. (B)

Day 10/11: Sunday, Nov. 14 - Quito - After breakfast, transfer to the airport for our flight home. Possible overnight flight arriving on Nov. 15. (B)

Our Ship - Traveling aboard the National Geographic Endeavour II, you'll enjoy the daily thrill of discovery without sacrificing comfort. The fully air-conditioned ship provides an inviting home base with superior amenities, personalized service and a vibrant yet casual onboard atmosphere. You'll find comfortable cabins, a well-stocked library, partially covered deck with tables and chairs, a sun deck, and a lounge with a full-service bar & facilities for films and presentations. Expansive decks provide an exceptional vantage point for spotting and photographing wildlife. This state-of-the-art ship is fully stabilized which allows for smooth passage between the islands of the Galápagos archipelago. This vessel carries 96 guests in 52 outside cabins. It is outfitted with a range of expedition equipment—including kayaks, Zodiac landing craft, a glass-bottom Zodiac, and snorkeling gear—ideally suited for exploring the wildlife-rich Ecuadorian isles and allowing for up-close exploration.

On-Board - A doctor and video chronicler accompany every voyage, basic Wi-Fi service, lectures and presentations, snacks, non-alcoholic drinks, beer, wine and spirits are included. Available for purchase - Premium liquor, upgraded Internet, laundry service, and a wellness program. Meals are served in a single seating with unassigned tables for an informal atmosphere and easy mingling. The menu is international with an Ecuadorian flair.

Experts on this Trip - The expedition team accompanies each voyage and is a diverse team of experts—from naturalists to regional specialists—who will share their knowledge and insights into the wildlife, landscape and local culture. We join the naturalists on interpretive island walks to learn about Galápagos wildlife and witness incredible interactions between animals in their natural habitat.

What to Expect - In keeping with the nature of an expedition, your schedule is kept flexible to take advantage of the unexpected, adapting course to the conditions and opportunities that arise. Your expedition experience can be tailored to the activity level you choose—whether it's light or moderate or a little of both. Daily activities may include Zodiac cruises, hikes, walking tours and visits to cultural or historic sites, with options for more physical activities such as longer hikes, biking or kayaking, dependent on conditions. Onboard lectures and presentations. Meet endangered Galápagos giant tortoises at a National Geographic-supported captive breeding program, then observe these creatures in the wild.

The overall activity level of this tour is “light to moderate”. Your expedition experience can be tailored to the activity level you choose. Guests should be in good health, comfortable walking or standing for extended periods of time and over very uneven surfaces. **Important:** Ability to get in/out of unstable expedition landing/water craft (Zodiac) is required. Tour is not a fit for travelers who require mobility assistance devices.

Transit Control Card: Once at the Quito airport, passengers must buy a US \$20 Transit Control Card at the INGALA counter to be used when entering and leaving the islands. This control card can only be purchased in cash at the airport. weTravel will help facilitate all visa requirements.

Travel Requirements: Passports are required for this tour at your expense. Passport be valid at least 6 months beyond the return date of this tour. **Air Seating:** Many airlines do not provide advance seat assignments until check-in at the airport. Advance seating will be subject to the airline's terms and conditions. We will do our best to secure your preferred seat. Baggage fees are traveler responsibility.
